The above Educational Foundation has its origins in a Deed by the Reverend Benjamin Carter, dated 1727 and still observes as its first priority the successful running of the South Wilford Endowed Church of England School.

After all expenses of administration and the requirements of the School have been met, the Trustees may offer Educational Grants. Such Grants are for the benefit of persons under the age of 25, resident (or having a parent resident) in the Ancient Parish of Wilford, and who are, in the opinion of the Trustees, in need of financial assistance. (The Ancient Parish of Wilford, in broad terms, included Wilford village, Silverdale, Compton Acres, part of West Bridgford, mainly west of Loughborough Road, and some of the south of the Meadows. The Foundation is administered by a Board of Trustees appointed by various local organisations named in the deeds. In considering Grants, the Trustees will take into account, among other factors, the nature of the Course the applicant will take or is taking, his or her previous educational record and financial status. The number and value of Grants are at the discretion of the Trustees, having regard to the number of applicants and the funds available. The Trustees have the right to revoke an award if the applicant fails to take up or continue a Course or if his or her performance on a Course is unsatisfactory. They also have the right to review an award in the light of the applicant's changed financial circumstances.

An applicant for an ANNUAL EDUCATIONAL GRANT must either have entered for or been awarded a place at a school, college/university, or any other course of education before an application can be considered. Grants are awarded for the ensuing academic year and applications must be received BY 31ST MAY annually. All applicants, both those who receive a Grant and those who are not awarded one, will be notified by the Clerk to the Trustees by the middle of August. Grants are awarded for educational purposes only and could be to support the beneficiaries in their studies at any school, college or university; or for travel in the U.K. or abroad to pursue studies; or for the study of music, other arts or sport. Application forms are available from the Clerk to the Trustees from Easter onwards annually or on the website (WRITTEN REQUESTS ONLY PLEASE)

The Trustees may, at any time make an OCCASIONAL/SPECIFIC GRANT to applicants on completion of their education, for assistance with the provision of books or equipment to enter a profession, trade or calling. They may also consider grants to enable beneficiaries to take part in workshops, field studies, short courses or training camps for sports or similar educational opportunities. Application forms are available from the Clerk to the Trustees (WRITTEN REQUESTS ONLY PLEASE) or on the website and should be submitted as soon as the need is identified.
